#### **Snow Procedures – Early Release**

As we enter the winter months, the chance of snow during the school day increases. The following information reviews Christa McAuliffe's early release procedures should the Lake Washington School District shorten the school day due to snow.

Parent Notification:

- Parents will be notified by call/email/text by District
- District will post an alert on District and McAuliffe Web sites
- McAuliffe will email our school's snow release procedures

#### Student Release Procedures:

- Parents are to pick up students at the outside classroom doors
- Teachers will verify that the person picking up the student is listed as a parent/alternate contact on the student's emergency card.
- Teachers may ask for ID, if needed
- Teachers will have parents sign out the student
- Teachers will only release students to parents/alternate emergency contact
- If adult picking up student is not listed as an emergency contact, the teacher will send them to the office. The front office will then call the parent/guardian to get a verbal "ok" to release the student.
