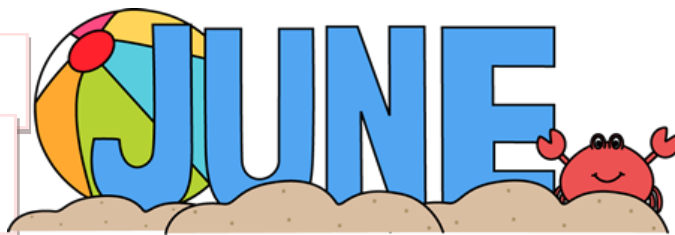

Class Placement Notification

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, otherwise known as "FERPA", states that schools must keep student information private. As a result, our school is unable to post class lists. Instead, your child will receive a personalized letter from next year's teacher welcoming them to their new class. Letters will be mailed to families at the end of August and prior to our annual "Meet and Greet" event. "Meet and Greet" will take place on Thursday, August 29th from 11:15-12:00. Our PTSA "Back to Business" event will be held the same day.

SBA Scores

SBA scores will be available to parents via Skyward Family Access on June 21st. Parents will be able to see math and ELA scores at this time, including a PDF of the actual detailed test report. Fifth grade science (WCAS) results will not be available until late August or September.
