### January Conferences

January conferences will be held on January 28th, 30th, and 31st. This is an opportunity for you and your child to revisit goals set in October, examine evidence of growth, revise goals, and discuss student progress. If you have not signed up for a conference, please contact your teacher to set up a time.

### Report Cards: Science Grades

This year our district is implementing a new science curriculum called Amplify, which will result in a change in how science scores are listed on report cards. Typically, parents see grades represented on a 1-4 scale for any topics covered. However, as our district works on aligning assessments with our new curriculum, parents will instead see a "+" on the report card this year for any areas taught. The only exception will be on the June report card, which will show a standard 1-4 score in the area of "Scientific Process". All other strands taught will continue to be a "+". A more detailed letter from our curriculum department will be included with January report cards outlining this change.

### Kindergarten Registration

Registration for next year's kindergarten classes will be held on Thursday, February 20th from 1:00pm-7:00pm in the commons. Children who will be 5 years old by August 31, 2020 are eligible to register for next year's kindergarten classes. Parents registering their children for kindergarten will need to provide 2 items for proof of residency within McAuliffe's school boundary (ex: utility bill), an original birth certificate or passport, and immunization records. Lake Washington School District kindergarten classes will be a **free all-day program**. It's important that incoming families register on February 20th as our registration numbers will determine staffing for next year.

### Principal Chat

Parents are invited to meet with Mr. Howden from 9:20-10:50 in the school library on Friday, January 24th. This is an open forum, with no set agenda. Parents are invited to stop by to say hello, ask questions, and learn more about our school. We hope you can join me for a few minutes.

### School Parking Lot Reminders

As we turn to the new year, we wanted to provide everyone with a few parking lot and pick-up/drop-off reminders:

- Please make sure your student is using marked and monitored crosswalks
- Student pick-up takes place in front of the school in the loading zone (please move forward as you wait)
- The side parking lot is not a student pick-up area, please park in a stall if you enter the side lot
- Please make sure to be respectful of our Instructional Assistant and Student Safety Patrol staff



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### Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA)

Students in grades 3, 4, and 5 will take the “Smarter Balanced Assessment” as their state assessment this Spring. The assessment will consist of 2-3 days of English Language Art/Literacy testing and 2 days of mathematics testing. Fifth grade students will also take a 1-day science test. We ask that parents do not schedule vacations or appointments on testing days (please see the schedule below). More information on state assessments will come later.

McAuliffe’s SBA Testing Schedule will be as follows:

3<sup>rd</sup> Grade: April 28, 29, 30 and May 5, 6

4<sup>th</sup> Grade: May 11, 12, 13, and 14

5<sup>th</sup> Grade: May 15, 18, 19, 20, and 21

School Districts”, select “Lake Washington SD”, create a count, and download the app.
